Eugene was hand-picked as the only city in the country for Serve's pilot program and we think it could be a great way for Marketeers to explore new ways to accept payments for goods and make more sales.

The kick off day is next Saturday, April 23, and the Serve team will have a tent next to the Info Booth for four Saturdays to provide education and assistance to vendors and customers who want to give Serve a try. During this time, you'll hear and see ads for Serve helping to promote the Market in local newspapers and radio stations.




