## **Holiday Market Tips: About Your Booth Space**

As you plan on how to use your space at the Holiday Market remember that unlike Saturday Market, where there is an extra inch here and there, there is no 'found' space in the Exhibit Hall. The aisles belong to your customers. No matter the size of your space, you are expected to keep everything-your chairs, your plants, your jewelry display, your cards racks, your signage-every-thing in the booth area marked by the tape on the floor. If the customer feels that the ability to walk through any part of our show is impeded, they will not come back to that area. Guaranteed.

There are also height restrictions of 10 feet for your booth (8 feet in the Holiday Hall) and signage in the Main Hall must not be over 12 feet high. Watch that any overhangs are at least 7 feet off the ground. We are squeezed in there pretty tight so we have to be especially respectful to each other and our customers as we share the space.

### Market's Annual Meeting This Weds., Oct. 2

The Market's Annual Meeting will take place at the Market Office this Wednesday, October 2. The Board of Directors will host an open house from 5:00 - 5:30 PM and they will provide refreshments. The meeting will be held from 5:30 - 7PM in the large room across the hall from the office. Beth will make the State of the Market address which will include up to date Market trends and income. All members are welcomed and encouraged to attend.



Hi Vendors! October 1st marks the beginning of the online application process to purchase or receive insurance coverage under the Affordable Care Act (Obama Care). Insurance will not take effect before January 1st, 2014. (F.Y.I. There is a financial penalty for being without health insurance in 2014, excepting just a few circumstances.) laptop and internet as well as staff hours to support Saturday Market vendors who wish to apply and prefer to have a little assistance in navigating this new process.

Those vendors who already have insurance through OHP or an employer will be receiving a letter with instructions. Those persons who are receiving assistance through SNAP will be receiving a letter with instructions to be fast tracked to get onto a program similar to the Oregon Health Plan.

I have completed the Cover Oregon training and will be available to meet with vendors by appointment beginning in a couple of weeks. I am no expert on this, but I will do my best to give you the tools you need to obtain insurance. Our goal is to provide you with a comfortable, barrier-free application process.
