In Loving Memory Toby Alves 12/11/1947-7/4/2022

Toby Alves started her Saturday Market booth, Tofu Palace, in 1978 and sold for almost four decades. She had previously sold candy and roasted nuts at the earliest Oregon Country Fair and Dickens Fairs, and owned the beloved Blair Island restaurant in the Whitetaker. What started as a way to feed her family and friends locally sourced, healthy foods grew into an iconic Pacific Northwest line of products. Her family business, Toby's Family Foods,

set an example of thoughtful, communitybased food production as it expanded from the Tofu Pate through seasoning mix, salad dressings, and other vegetarian/vegan prod-ucts, sold regionally. They innovated methods to increase shelf life without preservatives and were able to take on Genesis Juices, when those beloved raw juices faced regulations that would have required pasteurization.

Their reputation for prioritizing the health and safety of their workers made them a popular and dependable employer for many people, some who started as "Cooler Kids" helping to serve their Palace Cooler drinks at the Market and Fair. Her son Jonah took the business in the 1990s and continues to run it today. Since the Market booth was mostly Toby's domain, when she developed serious health problems she had to let it go. Her booth was so popular people still ask for her breakfasts today. Her attention to detail and presentation included always having flow ers on her counter, with her bright clear red, yellow, and green signs and packaging, even a simple toasted bagel was somehow better than any other you'd tasted before.

Many of us remember her as indefatigable, brave, and outspoken. She served on Food Committees, and was a part of many Market decisions and events. She always had a moment for you, no matter what she was doing, and was cheerful, warm, and gracious. In her semi-retirement she arranged and gave away or sold flowers from her gardens for events and celebrations. Bright orange Crocosmia will always remind me of Toby, put together with something purple and something hot pink. Roses were favorites as well.

Toby was a bright and shining firework with a visible spark that will last far beyond her years. We were lucky to have known her and to have been a part of her story. Saturday Market loves you, Toby, and knows you will Rest In Power.

Hello everyone. This week your Stan-dards Committee Co-Chairs would like to discuss logo items. Specifically Saturday Market logo items. Here is the guideline directly from the guidelines handbook

Logo Items:

The Standards Committee must approve any items with the Saturday Market name or logo at a Standards Committee meeting. The item must meet current Saturday Market standards.- Market Standards & Craft Specific Guidelines page 8.

Requiring that you bring a Saturday Market logo item to the Standards Committee is to assure that you use the Market logo in a appropriate manner. And yes there have been some inappropriate uses of the logo. The Market encourages you to make an item using the Saturday Market logo.

If you would like to sell and item with your own logo on it you must have designed the the logo yourself. You must bring it to the Standards Committee where it will it can be screened.

One last reminder from us, I have seen a lot of new members using a cash box. I know a cash box makes it seem like you're an astute business person but for us on the Park Blocks, it is a very tempting item for someone to just run off with. A much safer way to keep your cash is on your person. Whether you keep it in your pocket, in an over-the-shoulder crossbody purse, or a fanny-pack is safer. If you want to consider keeping your cash on your person, there are many members at the Market that make gorgeous vessels to hold your cash. Be it purses, fanny packs, or even an apron with pockets.
