

Happy Earth Day 2023!

April 22nd became the first Earth Day in 1970, as a response to rampant air and water pollution that was status quo at that time. Gaylord Nelson, junior senator from Wisconsin, with congressman Pete Mc-Closkey brought in young activist, Denis Hayes, to bring environmental education and activism to the nation.

The theme for 2023 is "Invest in Our Planet." Some suggestions from Earthday. org with this theme in mind:

plant a tree

- plant native plants and wildflowers (two for one benefit: supports pollinators)
- participate in a community garden begin a compost pile (or support com-

munity composting programs)
- conserve water (I know this feels counterintuitive this spring, but the weather folks say we're still below "seasonal water levels")

- bring your own mug wherever you go (or

water bottle)

- bring your own hand towel to Market (reduce need for paper towels)
- reduce the use of things that can't be re-

used or recycled commercially I suspect many of our members are al-

ready rather "eco-savvy" when it come to the 3-r's (reduce, reuse, recycle), and many actually "up-cycle" items into their art. It never hurts to use this day to remind ourselves of the interconnectedness of life on the planet and how things we choose to do can make an impact.

Whatever you decide to do to celebrate Earth Day this year, I encourage and challenge you to do it throughout the year – making "Earth Day Every Day".

We have a group of members who are interested in bringing the topics of sustainability to our apprises as more than Some

ability to our activities as a market. Some of our projects have been: bringing durable utensils to the Food Court; sorting trash at Saturday Market Park Blocks to compostables, recyclables and landfill, which reduced the volume of trash that was sent to the landfill; encouraging members to bring their own mug for drinks at food booths. Several of our programs were halted by concerns of virus transmission during the COVID-19 pandemic. We are hoping to bring back several of them as the modes of virus transmission have become more understood over the years.

Beware of Counterfeit Money

We handle a lot of cash at Saturday Market. You should always be on the lookout for fake money. Here are some tips:

- 1. Hold the bill up to the light. Check for a holograph of the face on the bill plus the thin vertical strip containing the denomination. Also, make sure the watermark can be seen on both sides of the bill. There is a security thread imbedded from top to bottom
- on the face of the bill.

 2. Color-shifting ink: If you hold the new series bill (except the \$5 note) and tilt it back and forth, please observe the numeral in the lower right hand corner as its color shifts from green to black and back.
- 3. Comparison: Test the feel and texture of the paper with other bills you know are authentic.

OCF Calls Spring Fling Raffle Donations




